President's Message—by Wayne Raupe



December 24, 2012

I want to thank those of you who attended the State Tournaments during this past year and congratulate all who shot your way to a Championship Title. Additionally, I am told, that there are several archers that are Grand Slam winners who will receive their Grand Slam Awards at the Banquet on January 26th. Some of you may not know what the Grand Slam Award is about so I will provide that information here. The **GRAND SLAM TOURNAMENT AWARD** is an award that is presented to any archer who wins Four State Championship Titles within a 12 month period. The archer must win a “Champion” title in each of the following State Championship Tournaments; Indoor, Field, Target and the Broadhead. The **CUB GRAND SLAM AWARD** is awarded to any Cub Archer, shooting in one style, who wins Three State Championship Titles within a 12 month period. The Cub must win a “Champion” title in each of the following State Championship Tournaments; Indoor, Field and Target. Cubs are not eligible to shoot the State Broadhead Tournament therefore they only have three tournaments to win. The cub archer must shoot an “A” class score in the State Field Tournament.

If you are not already training and on your way to winning the Grand Slam Tournament Award now is the time to start training as the first of the State Championship Tournaments will be the State Indoor and will be held at various locations in January. For those of you who have not yet attained the degree of skill to set your “sights” on the Championship Titles I encourage you to shoot more and hone your skills. If you find yourself at a plateau, not getting better, not shooting consistently, scattering your arrows around the spot, or grouping in a different area every time you go to the range, I recommend that you spend some time with an instructor/coach. An instructor will see the little things, or big things, that you are doing which are causing you problems and he/she can direct you into correcting them. Having the instructor take pictures or videos of you while you are shooting will give you a visual tool to garner information from that may allow you to identify the problem. Also it is sometimes easier for you to understand what the instructor is trying to have you correct if there is a picture to “show” you what you are doing wrong. You will be amazed at just how quickly your shooting improves and how much better your scores will be with just a few hours of help. Good Practice = Good Results!

On December 12, I attended the Fish and Game Commission (Commission) Meeting in San Diego and took with me the CBH/SAA Proposals that your CBH/SAA Region #6 Legislative Representative, Jerry Maytum, and CBH/SAA Legislative Coordinator, Robert Moore, had generated for presentation to the Commission. The first four Proposals include a **Silver Arrow Elk Tag, Silver Arrow Nelson Bighorn Sheep Tag, Silver Arrow Antelope Tag and Silver Arrow Deer Tag**. These four tags would be Fund-raising tags which would be designed to raise money for habitat protection and enhancement and also for maintaining proper management of the big game species. These tags would also give all hunters another opportunity to pursue the specified species with a bow and arrow.

The fifth Proposal I took is for a **Tinnemaha Archery Only Buck Hunt**. This is a proposal for a new **Archery Only (AO) Buck Hunt** in Inyo County, adjacent to the town of Big Pine. This hunt would open the second Saturday in November and extend for sixteen (16) days. For the years with five (5) Saturdays in November, the season would open on the third Saturday and extend for sixteen (16) days. This Tinnemaha proposal has been presented many times in the past and we are hoping the Commission will approve the hunt this time as there is no biological or scientific data to oppose it, instead, the data supports it. In the past there has been some opposition from the DFG Enforcement Division. Their opposition is based upon the lack of Warden Manpower to cover the area. That argument holds hollow as the DFG is “Mandated” by law, to Properly Manage All Big Game Animals and does not allow for the disregard of any herd in their management plan. To disregard any portion of a population or herd will allow it to out grow the carrying capacity of the habitat which would lead to disease, starvation and ultimate decimation of the herd. Additionally, lack of Manpower can not be the driving force in stopping or denying the establishment of a hunt as DFG is still mandated to manage the species and herds. Furthermore, as stated by the Deputy Director of DFG, at the December 12th Commission Meeting, for the first time in many years DFG will have a full compliment of Wardens in a few weeks when the current class of cadets, in the DFG’s Warden Academy, graduate. With all that being said, this may still be an uphill battle. The Commission will be reviewing these Proposals and will include them in their Agenda for public comment and discussion at the Commission Meetings in 2013. The Legislative Team and I can always use your help during the Public Comment on these Agenda Items. Please contact Robert Moore, Legislative Coordinator, and me to let us know if you are able to attend so a planed approach can be created.

President's Message -by Wayne Raupe

The 2013 F&G Commission Meeting Schedule is:

February 6&7 in Sacramento; March 6&7 in Mt. Shasta; April 17&18 in Santa Rosa; May 22&23 in LA; June 26&27 in Truckee; August 7&8 in Long Beach; September 4&5 in Sacramento; October 2&3 in Ventura; November 6&7 in Santa Barbara; and December 11&12 in San Diego.

Also, I again addressed the Commission with regards to the **Archery Only (AO) Pheasant Season**. I took with me a written Proposal that I generated showing the changes to the **Archery Only Pheasant Season** that I had requested on August 8, 2012. On August 8, the Commission accepted our verbal Proposal but because they had nothing before them, in writing, to base their motion on, the motion was stated incorrectly and the vote that followed retained the season as it has been for years (*see my October, 2012 message*). This time as I addressed the Commission, leaving nothing to chance, I explained to them what had occurred back on August 8th, what the proposal was that I was presenting and then provided each of the Commissioners with a copy of the Proposal. The Commissioners at this point all had an acknowledging look of "oops" (I am keeping it clean) on their faces. Without saying a word, using only body language, they conveyed to me that they would correct their error. I returned to my seat and then DFG Deputy Director, Dan Yparraguirre, approached me and thanked me for approaching the error in the respectful fashion that I had. He then assured me that the Archery Only Pheasant Season, as I proposed, would be included in the 2013 Waterfowl and Upland Game Hunting Regulations. The **AO Pheasant Season** will open on October 12th, the second Saturday in October and run for four (4) consecutive weekends ending on Sunday, November 3rd, five days before the beginning of the General Pheasant Season which starts on November 9th, the second Saturday of November. Now, don't forget the bow and arrow is also a legal weapon to hunt with during the General Pheasant Season.

Those of you who have not or are not involved in establishing AO Seasons or changes to existing seasons may be surprised to know that this simple AO Pheasant Season proposal has been presented to the Commission many times in the past. The first that I recall dates back into the 1990's. The problem with establishing a new hunt, or making a change to an existing hunt, is getting all of the ducks in a row. Timing, studies, proposals, DFG biologists input, DFG Directors support, public support and other influences must all come together so the Commission can make a well informed decision and only then will they approve the proposal.

VERY IMPORTANT NOTICE!!! Deputy Director Dan Yparraguirre addressed the Commission with regards to an issue the Wardens have been having in the field. He stated that, as it stands now, **Lighted Nocks in California are Illegal when used while hunting**. He proposed to the Commission that they legalize them. He stated... **They are not a Method of Take but rather a Method of Recovery**. CBH/SAA will be supporting that proposal but those of you who plan on entering your animals in the Record Books of CBH/SAA Big Game Club and/or the Pope and Young Club must remember that no electrical devices may be attached to any part of your bow, quiver, stabilizer, sight or arrow. **Any** electrical devices will disqualify your trophy from being entered into the Record Books.

There is one possible exception to the "Lighted Nock" rule for those of you that insist on using lighted nocks while hunting. I read in the August 2012 Petersen's Bowhunting magazine, "Follow the Light", an article that tests and ranks illuminated nocks and their performance. In this article they discuss the Sterner Duttera Fire Fly lighted nock which uses a small chemical glow stick to produce the light instead of batteries. The article goes on to say that the Fire Fly is legal per Pope & Young Guidelines. To verify this I consulted the **Pope & Young Guidelines** and found under **Equipment Definitions:...** *Definition of a Hunting Bow, Arrow & Broadhead...* where I found... **II. Hunting Arrow... B. Exclusions: No electronic or battery-powered devices shall be attached to the arrow.** Now Please note that I found no discussion about the use of a Chemical Glow Stick anywhere in the "Definition or Exclusions" so it is your responsibility to confirm with Pope & Young to determine that the use of the Fire Fly will not disqualify your entry into their Record Book. The CBH/SAA Big Game Club will have to review the use of the Fire Fly (Chemical Glow Stick) and make a Committee decision to allow or disallow its use when considering the eligibility of trophies being entered into their Record Book. So, please be forewarned.

Archery Helping Communities: We, Organized Archery, are donating Thousands of Dollars to our communities and no one knows about it. These toys were subsequently given to more than 100 children who would not have received any Christmas presents on Christmas Day if it had not been for the generosity of the attending archers and the participating club. As I look at the November and December Calendar for 2012, I see that the following clubs held similar **Toys for Tots** shoots: **Northwoods Bowmen... Conejo Valley... Riverside Archers... Maya Archers... Bowhunters Unlimited... Fresno Field Archers... Mojave Archers... and Straight Arrow Bowhunters.** I want to recognize each of the clubs and thank each of you who attended the shoots for your generosity, your caring and your effort that made a child happy on Christmas Day. If I have missed any club that participated in this effort please contact me and let me know as I want to recognize your effort as well. I am also asking that every club give me a participant count, a toy count and the number of approximate children you touched with the donated toys from that event. Most clubs do not deliver the toys to the children themselves but rather delivered the toys to independent organizations such as churches, community centers, or other charity organizations for disbursement to the children. I am also aware that many, if not all, of the organizations to which the clubs donate do not reciprocate by sending any sort of "Thank You Letters" to the clubs or give them recognition when the toys are handed out. This should change, but only the individual clubs can make the change occur. The club must make it a requirement that they get recognition before they donate to the organization. I think most organizations would accept these "STRINGENT?" conditions when they are getting a \$2,000 donation. Otherwise, our donations should be given to an organization that would agree to such conditions. California International Bowhunter Education Program Annual Report

This year we had 39 new instructors added to Cal/IBEP instructor core which bring our number of instructors to 140. The IBEP instructors along with 900 Hunter Ed. Instructors taught 23,000 classes this year. The volunteered instructors save the state \$953,000 (That's what the state would have to pay to have state employees teach all of the classes.) There is still a need for new IBEP instructors.

I talk to Captain Roy Griffith, the head of CA Hunter Education Program, and he informed me that there is no new word on the subject of mandatory Bowhunter Ed in California. He has been talking to Nevada's head of Hunter Education Program and Nevada is thinking about making it mandatory. Capt. Griffith informed me that if and when it is mandatory in California he would like CBH/SAA to take the lead in the construction of the regulation so California bowhunter get the best deal possible. I agree.

Last year the Governor sign in to law a new bill that offers IBEP/Hunter Ed instructors the opportunity to go on incentive hunts to help recruitment. This year there were 25 hunts offered. Below is a list of all of the hunts.

- 1 hunt for a management buck – Stewart Ranch
- 4 hunts for 2 deer – Catalina Island
- 1 youth buck hunt – Buckeye Ranch (youth of IBEP/HEI choice)
- 10 wild pig hunts – Tejon Ranch
- 1 wild pig hunt – Lombarado Ranch
- 1 bear hunt – Green Diamond Ranch
- 1 guided waterfowl hunt for 2 IBEP/HEI – Goldsberry Duck Club
- 1 wild turkey hunt for 2 – Soper-Wheeler Ranch
- 1 wild pig hunt – Burrow's Ranch
- 1 guided froggen trip
- 2 Shooting Enterprises 6 birds + 110 clays for 2 IBEP/HEI's
- 1 hunt for 2 IBEP/HEI's 50 clay targets 5 birds + cleaning

Anyone interested in these great hunts, become IBEP/HEI instructor and get eligible for the drawings.

LEGISLATIVE NEWS By: Robert Moore

The Fish and Game Commission will have Dan Richards seat expiring in January. Dan will stay on the Commission until the Governor appoints a replacement. Richard Rodgers seat has expired last year but since the Governor hasn't appointed his successor he will remain. Commissioner Jim Kellogg term has also expired but was reappointed by the Governor and is waiting confirmation from the state Senate.

The annual CBHSAA meeting at the end of January will be in Santa Ana. Friday afternoon will be the Legislative meeting going over the last year's events and looking into the next year's prospects. If you have interests contact either your regional legislative representative, State region representative or State Coordinator with your input.

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) have always required hunters to send in the completed report cards on game tags. Bear tags have always been mandatory whether you were successful or not. Most states such as Idaho you must complete all report cards online before you can purchase next years licenses and game tags. New this year from CDFW is online reporting of all game tags and report cards. For now you have the option of submitting report cards by delivering to any CDFW office, snail mail and now online. Submittal of the report cards helps CDFW biologists collect additional data required for species management. Failure to collect enough data could result in lost hunting for that species. Previously CDFW didn't push the collection of deer report cards that were unsuccessful but now it's easier to give that information by filing online. Sometime in the future CDFW may make filing mandatory in order to purchase next year's tags and permits.
