Let's Talk Bowhunting

Hello everyone, it is the start of another hunting year and we all should be getting ready for it, turkey season is just around the corner. We should be getting all our equipment ready for all the coming seasons. The modern bowhunter has lots more equipment (or gadgets) then his predecessor. Bowhunting has gone hi-tech. Whether these new toys are any better than the old ones, that is up to the hunter that uses them but I think some are great and have made bowhunting a lot more fun and enjoyable.

In the photo I have listed some of the typical new things you might find in a modern bowhunters back pack. 1) A Thermacell. 2) Nikon 550 Range Finder. 3) Kodak camera. 4) Garmin/Rhino 530HCX GPS. 5) Stealth cam viewer for SD card. 6) Gerber Carnivore. 7) Firefly. 8) flash light. 9) Smart phone/ solar battery charger. You might recognize a few of these but not all of them so let me explain them to you and their uses.

The Thermacell is a Mosquito repellent. A silent-burning butane cartridge heats an odorless, chemically treated repellent mat that keeps mosquitoes out of a 225 sq ft. area for up to 12 hours. Fire up the portable Thermacell and enjoy a day in your tree-stand or blind in bug free peace. (Old school, you would wipe on a hand full of 95% Deet.)

The Nikon 550 is a laser range finder that uses Nikon's advanced Incline/Decline (ID) technology to allow you to range targets from a tree-stands or in steep terrain just like over flat ground, without time-consuming calculating or risky guessing, very nice to have. (Old school, practice shooting a lot from steep angles or guess a lot.)

I always carry a camera. The Kodak in the photo is a digital compact that is small enough for my back pack and it takes great pictures. (Old school, Kodak camera but it weights 2lbs and I have to get the film developed.)

The Rhino 530 HCX is a GPS unit that is also equip with a two-way radio, it is great when you hunt with partners you want to stay in contact with and not get lost. (Some state outlaw the

Additionally, in attendance, there were 17 individuals who had been previously inducted into the Hall of Fame and we had 10 past presidents in attendance.

We had lots of business to conduct at the Annual Meeting, as we always do. We got much accomplished and I think we are on the right track. I chaired the Legislative Team meetings and I feel we made great strides. We stressed the importance of growing the Legislative Defense Fund so that the Legislative Team can meet our financial obligations and at the same time protect our sport. Believe me, we will find ourselves in court one of these days defending our right to shoot and hunt with a bow. It is just a matter of time. You and your club can help the Defense Fund grow by having your club Board of Directors consider collecting Defense Fund Donations in a donation canister(s) at all of the clubs scheduled shoots. Jason Rhine, from California Outdoor Heritage Alliance (COHA), gave us a rundown on what COHA has been doing and what they will be doing this year. One of the things he reminded us about is the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS). They are searching for the most vulnerable hunting seasons to eliminate. Can you guess what three groups they are currently looking at...? Dove Season, Bear Season and... Archery Season!! They will be doing their best to eliminate our seasons by tugging the emotions of the voters that: (1) don't hunt but believe in the philosophy and (2) don't care one way or another about our sport. These two groups equal 80% of the voters. If HSUS turns them around, we loose. So we must be proactive not just reactive. The future, sooner or later, will not be nice to us so we have to be prepared.

Mission Trail Bowhunters Association (MTBA) is leading the way in Fundraising as they made a financial commitment to the Board and me. Also they are challenging all the other regions and clubs in the state to match their donations. Watch for the challenge.

I am leaving the Legislative Coordinator Office in the very capable hands of Robert Moore. Also as President Elect I was able to, during my appointments, man all six DFG Regions. Region 1, Bill Heins; Region 2, Joe Wylie; Region 3, Eddie Boyd; Region 4, Alan Meurer; Region 5, Bill Kuehn; and Region 6, Jerry Maytum. Thank you for volunteering your service to CBH/SAA and congratulations on your appointments to this very active and vital team.

I would like to officially thank California Inland Bowhunters Association (CIBA) for hosting the Annual Meeting and the California Hall of Fame Banquet this year. They did a fantastic job and I look forward to their participation again in the future.

I want to show my humble gratitude to three STARS of our organization. These three give their time 24 x 7 and they keep CBH/SAA running like a Swiss Clock. use of radios while hunting, so please read the rules). (Old school, compass and hand/arm jesters or shouting, if you want to be quiet there is Morse code or flag waving).

The SD card viewers, Geber Carnivore, and the FireFly are new items to bowhunting that aids the hunter in locating and retrieval of his game. The card viewer allows you to views SD cards from Trail-cams so you can easily keep track of the deer in your area. The Carnivore is a hand held light that diffuses different colors of light together to make blood easier to see when you are blood trailing at night. Firefly is a new wind detector. If you hunt in an area where the wind direction changes by the minute it is a great piece of equipment to have. (Old school, lots of personnel scouting, Coleman lantern and plenty of feathers).

Everyone knows about all the uses of the Smart phone and how they can use them to aid in their hunting plans but did you know about the Solar Charger for your phone. Not only can it charge your phone but it will charge some if not all of the items I have mention in this article. The Charger is light weight and lays flat which makes it great to pack and carry. (Old school, lots of dry cell batteries).

Those of you who have not tried to use some of these items should give them a try to see if you can find a spot for them in your hunting plan and those of you who have tried them please e-mail or write me and let me know what you thought about them.

Last year (2011) the California Department of Fish and Game (DFG) did away with being able to sign a declaration for the purchasing of a CA/hunting license. Now you have to show proof of attending a Hunter Ed class or a hunting license from any previous year to be able to buy a CA hunting license. So hunter if you cannot produce a Hunter Ed certificate or a previous CA hunting license from any year please plan ahead so you can find a Hunter Ed Class in your area and not miss any hunting time.

California Roach, Chub, Tilapia, Squawfish and various baitfishes that have escaped into our fishing waters.

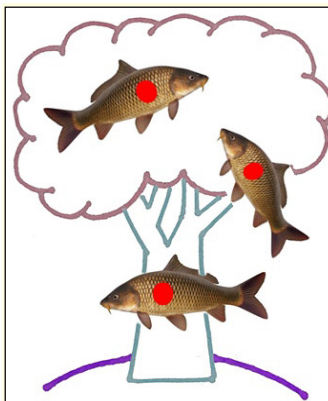
What do all these fish have in common and why should we want to know this? Number one is that these trash fish adversely affect game fish. Either by food competition or muddy water that makes egg-hatching percentage goes down or the completion for spawning ground. They are plentiful and in most every water body and stream especially carp in the San Joaquin Valley.

CBH is putting on a Carp and Gold Fish Jamboree June 2, 2012 in the Los Banos area and this is a low-key event that youth should enjoy. Just getting out on your bicycle and riding the dirt roads along the canals and into the duck ponds is an adventure. The place is loaded with wild birds, fish and small animals and boat or bicycle is the best way to fish the area. Having a bunch of scouts along to spot the carp as they raise to the top of the water will help your chance of finding a big fish.

What do you do with a dead carp, I will not tell you to eat it from muddy water although carp or goldfish that come from clean water are eaten all the time. The trick of it is to bleed your carp immediately and clean it and put on ice until you are ready to cook it. Put fish under hot water for several minute and peel the hide off. Cook in melted beef suet until crisp, which dissolves the forked bones (suet melts at higher heat than pork fat). Back East they serve free fish at Happy Hour and they use Buffalo Carp for the fish.

So what do you do with the dead Carp? You plant them under your mother in laws rose bushes and with prettier flowers she will be happy and your wife will let you go fishing (with the kids) more often. We call this a win- win – win situation. See you June 2, 2012 across the road from O'Neal fore bay.

Traditional Archers Corner

One month has zipped on by and we are ready to continue on with Gadgets and Gizmos used by some of the Traditional gang.

I think this one will interest our “Wheel” friends as well as some that aren't even archers.

In “Merry Old England” they are referred to as beggars mitts or gloves. Some, in our country call them “poor man's gloves”. In the competitive swimming fraternity they are called “warm-ups”. I choose to call them “Archer's Mitts”.

I first saw them at a “swim-meet” and noticed a bunch of the swimmers were running around with these funny looking “fingerless” gloves. They were in different colors and worn by young and old. Now this was a very cold and uncomfortable day and, for my own well being, I tried a pair of these things on and I was surprised by the warmth they afforded. I was completely intrigued by there simplicity and usefulness. It took only a second to see the value to the archer.

All you need to make these mitts, is a piece of fleece, access to a sewing machine or even a straight needle and spool of thread.

I chose fleece because it comes in a multitude of colors, it won't tear very easily, and stretches well to conform. Besides all it's physical characteristics it isn't very expensive (about \$5 a yard).

Cut a rectangle 8 ½ inches by 8 inches, fold the short way and sew up the sides to make an 8 x 8 ¼ inch tube (¼ inch used for sewing room). Turn the tube inside out (stitches are now on the inside) and measure down two inches, on the side opposite the stitches. Take a scissor snip ¾ of an inch long at that point. This snip makes an opening of 1 ½ inches for the thumb hole.



These mitts are great and, believe it or not, will keep most of your hand warm while allowing you to use a tab, glove or even a release without interference. It's great if you happen to have a metal riser.

The size used is for a man. If you are sewing for a lady or a young one, just take the dimensions down a little. My wife starts with a tube measuring 7 ½ x 8 and a thumb snip at 1 ¾ down.

Legislative Information

I have been appointed to the Legislative Coordinator position by the new President and confirmed by the CBHSAA board of directors. I previously held the Region 2 leg. Rep position in which Joe Wylie will assume those responsibilities. It's my intentions to have articles for this newsletter every month to keep the membership updated on what the legislative committee has focus on. Granted there will be times that there may be no new information on certain items and for purposes of the newsletter general conversations and other meeting notes with FGC, DFG and NGO's may not be included in the monthly articles. The CBHSAA web site should be making some changes and hopefully we will have more updated information available on the Legislative link of the web site.

Update to the Strategic Vision Project: The California Fish and Wildlife Strategic Vision Executive Committee, with assistance from BRCC and SAG, are developing three deliverables: The draft interim strategic vision in November 2011 (Completed), an interim strategic vision in February 2012, and a strategic vision by July 1, 2012.

Public Comments and recommendations for the draft interim strategic vision have been compiled and presented to the BRCC and SAG groups. Multiple meetings for several weeks in January had discussions and some consensus on issues to form recommendations to the interim strategic vision. The Interim Strategic Vision document should go to the Executive Committee sometime in February to meet the timeline established and before you receive this article. Visit the Strategic Vision website at www.vision.ca.gov for more information.

The mammal regulations for this hunting season shouldn't see any drastic changes. DFG presented to the FGC only quota changes as necessary following herd counts and surveys.

DFG is in the process of updating certain management plans for Big Game so until those are completed only minor changes should take place.

DFG will have 4 raffle drawing tags available for this year; one tag for Deer, one for Elk, one for Antelope (new) and one for Sheep (new).

The Legislative Committee continues to work with DFG on possible new hunt proposals. We look forward to the completion of the updated management plans so when we make proposals it has current science backing. Of course this all hinges on what the Legislature and Governor does with the Strategic Vision recommendations of FGC and DFG.

My background in Archery and Bowhunting for those who don't know started in the early 80's by purchasing a Bear Whitetail 2 bow and Archery only deer tags. The early 90's I had the privilege of taking an IBEP course with Joe and Joan Becker so I could bowhunt Idaho. These Hall of Fame inductees inspired me to become an IBEP instructor and started teaching under Johnnie Waddles in region 2. Joe also recommended me to take his place as the Nor Cal leg rep and later the Region 2 leg rep position. I assisted in organizing the initial meeting and follow up conversations between DFG, CBHSAA and NASP to move forward in bringing the NASP program to California. CBHSAA's involvement are volunteer instructors (BAIT) to train and certify teachers. From the first CAL NASP Instructor workshop in 2005 at Weimar Middle School to present, I continue to train teachers the NASP program under the designation of BAIT specialist with the direction of DFG. I do participate in a 4H archery project & training, USA Archery coaching & training, an After School Archery Program (NFAA), Archery Camps with my local Parks & Recs and run the archery range at the Wilderness Unlimited Foundation Youth Outdoor Camp. Previous articles written in this publication on partnering with other NGO's on having archery ranges at events involving youth will continue to be one of my goals. I know there are many other CBHSAA members and clubs getting the youth involved in archery also and I say "THANK YOU!". The youth are our archery and bowhunting future.

After shooting three holes, John Gary made his appearance and finished the tournament. The shooting was close and the end result was a draw.

Bullets and Bows

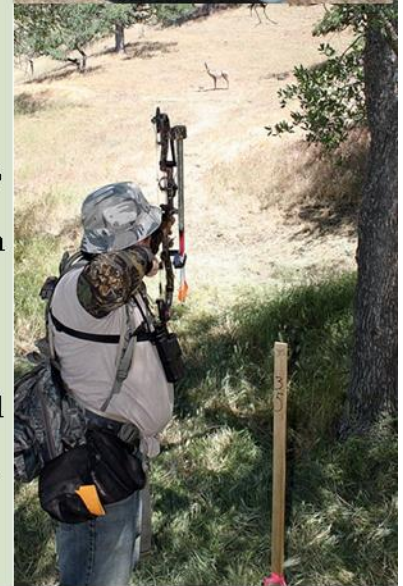

CBH/SAA Annual Meeting held 1-20/1-22, 2012 in Stockton

All regions were represented this year at the meeting and we had a great turnout. The meetings began Friday with the Legislative Committee and continued with the hospitality room Friday night presented by CIBA Region. Great food, drinks and conversation was had by all.

Saturday morning started early with the meeting at 8am by President Brent Sloan. The normal duties were taken care of with the Pledge of Allegiance, Invocation and roll call of officers and delegates with many guests being introduced. The officers gave their annual reports with Craig Fritz, 2nd VP Hunting, noting that this year will be the 50th anniversary of the Broadhead. Eddie Boyd, who is now Region Three Legislative Representative, has a trophy that was won by his grandfather at the very first tournament. We missed Tim Atwood this year as he was being inducted into the Riverside Sports Hall of Fame along with Don Brown, Louie Rangel and Martin Swanson.

Legislative Coordinator Wayne Raupe, introduced Jason Rhine, the Advocacy Director from COHA (California Outdoor Heritage Alliance). COHA is the lobbying group that CBH/SAA requests to represent ALL OF US archers for our rights, whether it be from pulling our bow back in our own back yard (yes, believe it or not) to our hunting rights. Jason discussed many bills in front of the legislature this year coming up, ones that they stood behind and ones that were opposed. COHA is a strong spokesperson for us and we are glad they are here to support us. If anyone is interested in more information on COHA (and they can do a presentation for your club or region), you can contact them or visit their website at www.outdoorheritage.org.

Johnnie Waddles our IBEP Chairman wants to see more archers get on board with being an instructor. There are a lot of the gun hunters that are becoming instructors and would like to see more archers. There are online courses available and a short field day course. Contact Johnnie for more information (see inside newsletter for his contact info).

Wayne Raupe reported on the bow fishing shoots; The Tilapia and the Carp. Look for more information on these shoots in the upcoming newsletters. Kim Artherton reported on the newsletter and is looking to revamp the style. You'll notice the changes!!

NFAA Petitions were reviewed and chewed over and Tom Daley will be taking our voice to the NFAA meeting in February and Tom has also been voted in for another two years...thanks Tom. There were a few CBH/SAA petitions that passed; #01-2012, The Historian being represented at the annual meeting for expenses, #02-2012, moving the election of 2nd VP Hunting to the even numbered years, #05-2012 passed with the addition of the Pro Division being recognized and then #03-2012 was withdrawn. All others did not pass.

Donations presented at the meeting were:

Big Game Club - \$500 to Hall of Fame, \$1,000 to California Archery Foundation & \$2,500 to Legislative Defense Fund

Orange Belt Field Archers (OBFA) donated \$250 to CAF and \$100 to Range Fund and \$500 to Leg Def Fund

Mission Trail Bowhunters Assoc (MTBA) donated \$1,000 to CAF and \$1,000 to Leg Def Fund.

Cascade Region donated \$600 to Leg Def Fund

Oranco Bowmen donated \$500 to Leg Def Fund

Unique Awards donated \$50 to Leg Def Fund

Awards will be changing for the 900 Round/Target, while on the State Field, you must shoot an "A" class score to receive the Championship buckle.

Rules & Regulations, Map and General Information on Back of Flyer

2012 CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

1. This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter as opposed to the tournament archer. It is designed to offer the hunter some benefits without his/her becoming entangled in the aspects of a Field tournament. NFAA rules do not apply to this event
 2. The State Broadhead Tournament shall be either a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
 3. The 2nd Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern this tournament.
 4. The ranges for this event shall be laid out in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
 5. Archers shall use hunting tackle for this event which is in keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.
- A. Scoring:
- 1) Vital - 10 Kill - 8 Wound - 5
 - 2) An arrow must be in the target to score, except a "Pass-through" which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
 - 3) "Bounce-ins and "Glance-offs" shall not score.
 - 4) "Antlers" do not score.
 - 5) Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.
 - 6) Double scoring is required.
 - 7) This shall be a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardage.
- B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:
- 1) Divisions
 - a) Seniors (65+)
 - b) Adult (18-64): Male and Female
 - c) Young Adult (ages 15-17): Male and Female
 - d) Youth (ages 12-14): Male and Female
 - 2) Styles
 - a) Sight (S)
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Release (R)
 - d) Recurve (Rc) – Adults and Seniors only
 - e) Traditional (T) - Adults and Seniors only
- C. Awards:
- 1) CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
 - 2) Guest Class is one class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
 - 3) No awards will be mailed.
- D. Tackle:
- 1) One stabilizer, not over 12 inches, allowed
 - 2) Bow quivers allowed in all styles.
 - 3) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
 - 4) No compound bows over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no limit for peak draw weight.
 - 5) Binoculars are allowed. No RANGE FINDERS!
 - 6) No range finding devices allowed at any time on the range.
 - 7) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot – expandable broadheads are allowed if they meet Ca. Fish & Game Codes.
- 8) Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Code (7/8" minimum diameter)
 - 9) Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
 - 10) All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
 - 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
 - 12) Longbows: Any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
 - 13) Clickers allowed in all styles.
- E. Miscellaneous:
- 1) Cubs: Due to safety considerations a Cub division will not be included in this event.
 - 2) Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
 - 3) All protests to the Protest Committee must be in writing within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the tournament and include a \$25.00 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
 - 4) There must be three or more shooters per target at all times.
 - 5) Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament.
 - 6) No target or sight notes allowed.(sight tapes ok)
 - 7) No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will not be assisted.
 - 8) No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours – except for tournament officials.
 - 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
 - 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
 - 11) NO cell phones, computers or any other electronic devices allowed on the range or bow.
 - 12) Tournament officials will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
 - 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualification.

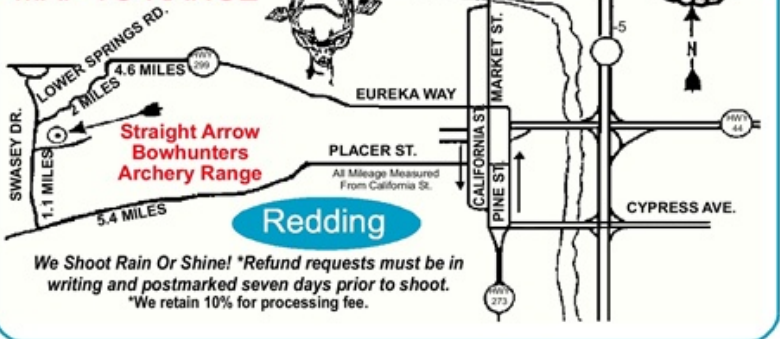
