URGENT

LEGISLATIVE NEWS-Robert Moore

The new president of the Fish & Game Commission, Dan Richards was successful on a recent Idaho mountain lion hunt. Dan's story was included in an article and picture in the Western Outdoor News the last week of February 2012. Some Animal Rights groups have jumped on this opportunity to attempt removing Dan from the FGC stating "while legal to hunt mountain lions in Idaho the commissioner was ethically wrong because it's illegal in Calif.". The state legislature can remove a FGC Commissioner by a simple majority vote in both houses. Assemblymen Ben Hueso (79th district) wrote a letter, got 40 other assembly persons to sign on asking Dan to remove himself from the FGC. Dan's response letter back to Ben (I'll paraphrase) was Hell No. While the letter is not binding it's a way to find a consensus of the group. A formal resolution would have to be submitted on the assembly floor and the senate floor to start the process. The controversy has heated up with the AR groups, Conservation groups and individuals commenting in many media venues. Contacting your state assemblymen and senator to voice your concerns is always a good thing regardless of this current event. While the CBH/SAA legislative committee is active on this in regards to our organizations position, individuals should also contact their state assembly and senator reps as their constituents who vote. DFG and FGC still have an ISOR document open with continued participation on uses with language clean up for State Wildlife Areas. One item of our continued pursuit is to allow bowfishing during the non hunting seasons. Currently language in the regulations states that firearms and bow and arrows can only be used for hunting purposes. Hunting is generally allowed from July or Sept. 1st to Jan. 31st thus no bows could be used for bowfishing any other time. We are pursuing added language to sections of regulations to incorporate bowfishing language as an exception related to Wildlife Areas.

The season for archery only pheasants was modified several years ago that resulted in just a 2 week archery only season. Due to a request from the public at a FGC meeting in Dec. 2011 DFG and CBHSAA are in discussions to make changes back to a 4 week archery only season to be included in this years upland bird regulation package to FGC.

Update to the Strategic Vision Project: The California Fish and Wildlife Strategic Vision Executive Committee, with assistance from BRCC and SAG, are developing three deliverables: The draft interim strategic vision in November 2011 (Completed), an interim strategic vision in February 2012 (Completed), and a strategic vision by July 1, 2012. The Executive Committee has adopted the recommendations from the BRCC and SAG on the Interim document. Continued meetings within the BRCC and SAG groups will continue to finalize the document by its deadline.

Rick has many years of experience in fundraising and he is willing to help CHB/SAA in those endeavors. Robert and I will be following up on that.

Until I see you hunting or on the range, be safe, shoot as often as you can and enjoy this sport. Always remember, no matter what kind of stick you bend or how many wheels/cams you have, we are all FAMILY!

Traditional Archers Corner:

Another month gone by and we are ready to continue with some of the Gadgets and Gizmos used by Traditional archers.

We all know that certain anomalies occur that may cause our arrows to stray from our intended aiming spot. We face wind shear, gravity pools, warm air vortex, magnetic-surge and, yes, the occasional arm bump from your shooting partner. All of these things cause our arrows to end up over the bales, under the bales, and a multitude of other places we are all too familiar with. One of the worst is when your nice, new, beautiful wood arrow is pinned under a bale band or wire.

I have run into this problem many, many times in my past and I was forced to come up with some kind of tool that could, possibly, help. Hence, a tool that I carry in my quiver every shoot, came into being. I call it The Arrow Saver. The Saver is simple to make and requires very little work and an extremely small amount of cash.

Buy a couple of feet of ½ PVC pipe and your cash outlay is complete. You will need a saw, a file, a piece of sandpaper (you know these things are scattered all over your garage). Cut the pipe to 16 inches and then cut, starting at about 2/3rds of the way down on one end of the pipe and slowly cut a taper up and out at about 4 inches from the opposite end. Use sandpaper to smooth the edges a little and the file to bevel the leading edge about 30 degrees. This is NOT an exact science and the measurements are approximate and what has worked for me. I have cut these things with a coping saw, a hacksaw and, my

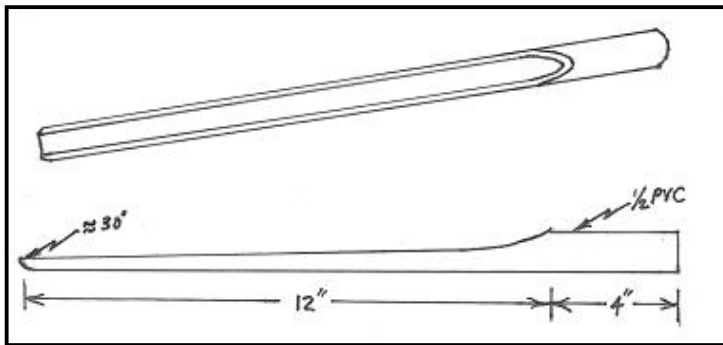
most favorite, my band saw. The edge bevel is just enough to slip under a band or wire. I drilled a hole in the handle end of my tool and tied on a piece of leather thong that allows easy extraction from my quiver.

To use the tool; just slip it along the arrow shaft and up between the band and the arrow and arrow will slip right out with little or no damage. I have used this tool to spread plywood, separate out corner seams and a myriad of other places where my arrows have landed.

I have saved countless inserts on my carbons and a bucket full of woods. Try it, you'll like it! See you behind the bales,

More Carp— By: Burt Malech

What will really make a difference in my carp hunt? It is easy to pick the first and most important piece of equipment that spells the difference between a great day and failure. Polarized glasses and cost is not necessarily the difference between good and bad glasses (I once bought a hundred and forty dollar pair and couldn't see any better than a fifteen dollar pair.)

Where you buy your glasses is important to success. A fishing store or catalog is your best chance to the right one for you. Remember that lots of things can and will happen when out in boat or anyplace near water so several pair are better than one. Different color glasses for sunny or cloudy days, grey, brown, yellow and black are available and usually fifteen to twenty bucks a pair. A good leather strap to hold them on your head (did you notice the word good?)

Let's talk about arrows---Solid fiberglass arrows with a rubber fins are standard equipment and helps flight on long shots. A fish head that opens up after hitting the fish works best for me. If you sharpen the blades it helps to penetrate the hard scales of big carp. Strings and reels is where we split into a hundred directions, as match of string and reels is vital to success. Today let me talk to the beginner and look at windup tape on reels. Each one of us has a different wind up circle and we need to know how wide that circle is before buying the right size.

Take pencil and cardboard and draw a circle over and over again (with right hand for right handed people). Then measure the width of circle and that is the size of reel you need. Fishing catalogs maybe your best bet. After one hundred wind ups on a hot carp day you see the reason for this.

If you are planning on getting a big one, a jug set up on your bow is a good thing to have. When ocean fishing it is necessity if you do not want to lose your bow when the fish hits the end of the line.

Face paint so the reflection off the water does not fry your skin, and while you're at it, get colored cream (tan or brown as fish can see a white face) if that is a problem.

A bottle of water and candy bars (they sell healthy ones) and a small knife and small pliers, one of those thirty tool things in a strap on a kidney pack, really helps on a long day. An extra string and a couple of spare arrows and we are ready to go. A sack to put fish in helps.

The thing is you have to start now as it takes time to get all the right stuff ready to go and all in one place. Part of the adventure is seeking out the set up and the first hunt is a testing run as probably you will need to correct the stuff that does not work smoothly all day. Several test runs should be behind you before you show up at the **CBH Carp Jamboree June 2 across from O'Neil Fore bay**. Win or loose if your equipment work it is called fun.

If you could change a hunting regulation, which one would you change? Why would you change it? "Eliminate the Counties Fish and Game Commissions authority to veto hunts.

County FGC decisions tend to be more political than science based. Game management should be about the science first."

What advice would you give to new IBEP/ Hunter Education Instructors? "Be open to new ideas and ways, there's more than one way to skin an animal."

Do you have a favorite camouflage pattern, or a favorite color of Long John? "Spring Green Predator Camo."

What is your favorite Game Food?" Split between Elk and Pig."

University Long Beach last year ranked 5th in the National Championships. At the State Indoor in January in Tulare, 15 people, three in each division, took 6 of the 15 medals including 4 of the 5 gold medals. CSULB has been competing continuously since 1963, the longest of any collegiate club in the United States.

The team has had school support but with cut backs clubs will see less funding. How much funding and how much the team raises will determine the number of team members traveling to compete. The National championships are at James Madison University in Harrisonburg Virginia this year.

An Olympic Dream By Julie Robinson

I believe that everyone at one time or another in their lifetime has or had dreamed about becoming an Olympian. When I was little and every time the Olympics came on T.V. I would just watch in awe, and wonder what it would be like to be there...participating in the Parade of Athletes from around the world. Not so much as to win a medal, but just to be part of competing with the best athletes in the world.

As time passed, that dream still settled deep within my desires. I have always been an athlete of some sort, but how I saw myself...just average, not good enough for the Olympic level. I had no real commitment to myself to do better in any sport that I played.

As I traveled from job to job to gain more knowledge and experience, the dream of becoming an Olympian was fading. And then it hit me as I was watching the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia. I decided to set off and commit myself to being better than average in one sport than just average in all the sports I participated in, and try for the Olympics in 2004. I went to the official Olympics website and looked at all the events, and decided to give archery a try. I chose archery because it was an individual yet team sport. I could practice on my own schedule and choose which tournaments I wanted to compete at in preparation for the Olympic Trials. All I needed to do was get a qualifying score from a tournament by the designated date.

In 2001, I set out with vigor and vigilance, committing myself to become better than average in the sport of archery. In years past, every time I had a bow in my hand, I found that I had a natural talent to hit the target consistently (just goofing around with the guys at renaissance faires and such). Now mind you, I was on a fast track to trying to make the 2004 Olympic team, but I thought if I don't put full commitment into this, I will have just failed myself, as I have done in the past.

Since I was living in Long Beach, and El Dorado Park was nearly in my backyard, I had a perfect place to practice. I would be out on the archery range 5-7 days a week, mornings and evenings depending on the season (as I was able to flex my work schedule to allow adequate practice time). I competed at state and national tournaments to get a feel for real archery jitters with all the other archers doing the same.

Then in July 2003, while I was competing at the National Outdoor Target Championships, something wicked happened. I severely strained a tendon in my right arm and had to drop out of the tournament. I felt at this point my Olympic dream had come to an end. I was in so much pain that I didn't feel I could recover from the injury. I went back to Long Beach, set the bow down for two months, received acupuncture and physical therapy on my arm, and walked just about every stretch of beach from downtown Long Beach to Huntington Beach. I picked up my bow in October, lowered the poundage just enough so I could shoot without as much pain, and shot a qualifying score at the Duel in the Desert tournament. I needed to shoot a score of at least 1180, and I shot a 1201. I put the bow back down for two more months to get some extra healing time.

I requested a six month leave of absence from my employer so I could put full efforts into my training. I was denied, so I resigned my position, sold my condo, and moved to Ohio to train with a friend who was also training for the Olympics in archery.

While I was in Ohio, I was introduced to field archery. I found field archery to be a lot more fun (hiking through the woods and shooting at different size targets at different distances and elevations) than just standing on the shooting line shooting arrows out to 70 meters in the wind and rain. I competed at the National Field Championships/World Trials (because they were held in Ohio, so I didn't have to travel out of state for this tournament) and finished in 3rd place and won a spot on the World Archery Field Team to compete in Croatia in July, 2004 at the World Archery Field Championships.

At this point I felt if I didn't make the Olympic team (which they only take the top three), I had my consolation prize of going to Croatia instead. I finished 26th at the trials, and I felt pretty good about my finish because I had only been shooting three years, and that's a major accomplishment in such a short time. Since then I have turned my focus towards field archery, and am having a blast with it.

That's my story, and I'm sticking with it.

Rules & Regulations, Map and General Information on Back of Flyer

2012 CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

1. This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter as opposed to the tournament archer. It is designed to offer the hunter some benefits without his/her becoming entangled in the aspects of a Field tournament. NFAA rules do not apply to this event
 2. The State Broadhead Tournament shall be either a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
 3. The 2nd Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern this tournament.
 4. The ranges for this event shall be laid out in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
 5. Archers shall use hunting tackle for this event which is in keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.
- A. Scoring:
- 1) Vital - 10 Kill - 8 Wound - 5
 - 2) An arrow must be in the target to score, except a "Pass-through" which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
 - 3) "Bounce-ins and "Glance-offs" shall not score.
 - 4) "Antlers" do not score.
 - 5) Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.
 - 6) Double scoring is required.
 - 7) This shall be a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardage.
- B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:
- 1) Divisions
 - a) Seniors (65+)
 - b) Adult (18-64): Male and Female
 - c) Young Adult (ages 15-17): Male and Female
 - d) Youth (ages 12-14): Male and Female
 - 2) Styles
 - a) Sight (S)
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Release (R)
 - d) Recurve (Rc) – Adults and Seniors only
 - e) Traditional (T) - Adults and Seniors only
- C. Awards:
- 1) CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
 - 2) Guest Class is one class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
 - 3) No awards will be mailed.
- D. Tackle:
- 1) One stabilizer, not over 12 inches, allowed
 - 2) Bow quivers allowed in all styles.
 - 3) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
 - 4) No compound bows over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no limit for peak draw weight.
 - 5) Binoculars are allowed. No RANGE FINDERS!
 - 6) No range finding devices allowed at any time on the range.
 - 7) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot – expandable broadheads are allowed if they meet Ca. Fish & Game Codes.
- 8) Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Code (7/8" minimum diameter)
 - 9) Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
 - 10) All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
 - 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
 - 12) Longbows: Any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
 - 13) Clickers allowed in all styles.
- E. Miscellaneous:
- 1) Cubs: Due to safety considerations a Cub division will not be included in this event.
 - 2) Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
 - 3) All protests to the Protest Committee must be in writing within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the tournament and include a \$25.00 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
 - 4) There must be three or more shooters per target at all times.
 - 5) Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament.
 - 6) No target or sight notes allowed.(sight tapes ok)
 - 7) No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will not be assisted.
 - 8) No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours – except for tournament officials.
 - 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
 - 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
 - 11) NO cell phones, computers or any other electronic devices allowed on the range or bow.
 - 12) Tournament officials will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
 - 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualification.
