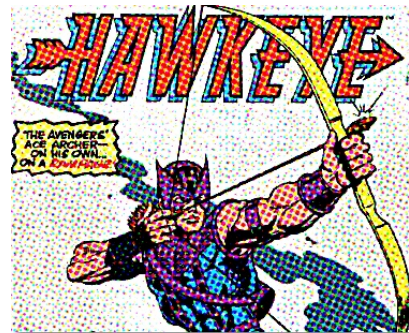

President's Message—by Wayne Raupe



I have “Officially” been the President of CBH/SAA for less than 30 days and it seems like I have been there for the last year and a half. Transitioning from the Legislative Coordinator (LC) to the president is like.... no change. The jobs entail being vigilant of all things that help the organization and our sport but most importantly that which adversely impacts us. Both offices must act accordingly and address the situation at hand. Both have to be politically correct (PC) at times. However, when assigned the responsibility of representing “ALL” archers in California, we sometimes have to abandon the PC approach and instead we must be very assertive and forthright when confronting the challenger head on. Our job is to stop all assaults on our sport and heritage, when ever and wherever it occurs, making sure CBH/SAA remains a health and growing organization. During the past 14 months I have been doing just that. Then, four days after my official Presidency began, I along with approximately 100 other

sportsmen, sportswomen and Outdoors Groups, spoke on behalf of the Fish and Game Commission (F&GC) President, Daniel Richards. This was one of those times when being PC went by the wayside and we had to speak the truth but speak with conviction. Because the sportsmen and sportswomen rallied to oppose a radical agenda we were able to stop the assault.

However, this was just the 1st phase of Assemblymen Hueso’s plan as he is now trying to introduce changes in the F&GC so that there is a greater chance that a pro-hunter Commissioner will never be President of the Commission. This would happen as soon as the Commission was made up of a majority of Anti-Hunters. Additionally, Hueso is also sponsoring a bill to establish “Conflict of Interest” language that would allow the

removal of the Commission President and or Commissioner at the whim of the anti-hunting radical legislators. The “Conflict of Interest” could be as simple as a member of the Commission participating in some sort of hunting activity. So, in his 2nd phase, we must stop Hueso’s attack and then we must establish our own guidelines for the F&G through our own legislation as soon as possible. With your help we can get this done.

Please keep abreast of the current issues by going to our web-site and look for the Legislative section where Robert Moore, Legislative Coordinator, and his team provide updates and information for you. We are doing our best to provide you with the links to your legislators and in some cases provide you with a letter to modify when we need you to send a letter. We need you to do your part in making your voice heard so please stay current and alert.

Speaking of staying alert, Bret Scott, from Riverside, saw an alert referencing SB-1221, on one of his favorite web-sites that will prohibit the use of dogs for hunting bear or bobcat. That bill is sponsored by the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS). Bret started shot gunning everyone on his e-mail list which included me. Thanks to him Robert and I got the information and started getting the word out to our members. The alert has the e-mail address of the two Senators who introduced the bill and also it has links to your local legislators. If you have not received this informative e-mail contact Robert or me so we can get it to you. We need your help to stop this bill so please go to the web-site and e-mail as many legislators as you can and let them know you want this bill defeated. Also, please, if you see something or hear something that we should know about don’t hesitate to notify us. Don’t assume we already know about it.

Robert Moore, Pam Severtson and I are compiling a list of e-mail addresses from, you, our members, so that when issues come up where we need an immediate response from you we can get it. We currently have most of your e-mail addresses but we don’t want to use them without getting your approval first. I assure you that this list will only be used for important notifications, no jokes, chain letters or such. So, I am asking you to take a few minutes to register on the Legislative web page or to: legalerts@cbhsaa.net, or send Pam <mpsevertson@frontiernet.net> and/or me <wraupe@sbcglobal.net> an e-mail giving us approval to send alerts. It is vital to your rights as a target archer, a hunter, an angler, a falconer... it makes no difference what you love doing... extremists are trying to take that right away from you.

On a lighter note... the archery tournament season is in full swing and turkey season will start in two days, March 31st. I wish you all successful in the competition and also in the pursuit of that wily ol’ tom turkey.

Until next time... May the path to your goals and happiness be like the flight of the enchanted loosed arrow... a thing of beauty.

ALL 2012 HUNTING SEASONS CANCELLED!

California Governor Jerry Brown has just announced a joint partnership with the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) that has put an end to all hunting in the Golden State. All current hunting tags and licenses are now invalid and anyone caught violating this new law will face fines, imprisonment, and loss of their equipment. Animal rights activists are rejoicing their triumph in ending hunting and plan to sweep new laws into other western states, as well as put an end to fishing.

Outdoor sports groups are trying to muster a protest and have threatened to challenge the new laws in court but it is very doubtful they will have any success against the huge financial resources available to the HSUS. The announcement comes as no surprise to those in the know as they have witnessed the continued advance of the HSUS into the Department of Fish and Game. The HSUS has recently been associated with the funding of warden training and poaching reward programs, and has even gained seats on prestigious outdoor use panels. In the past month they even orchestrated the unsuccessful removal of the President of the California Fish & Game Commission.

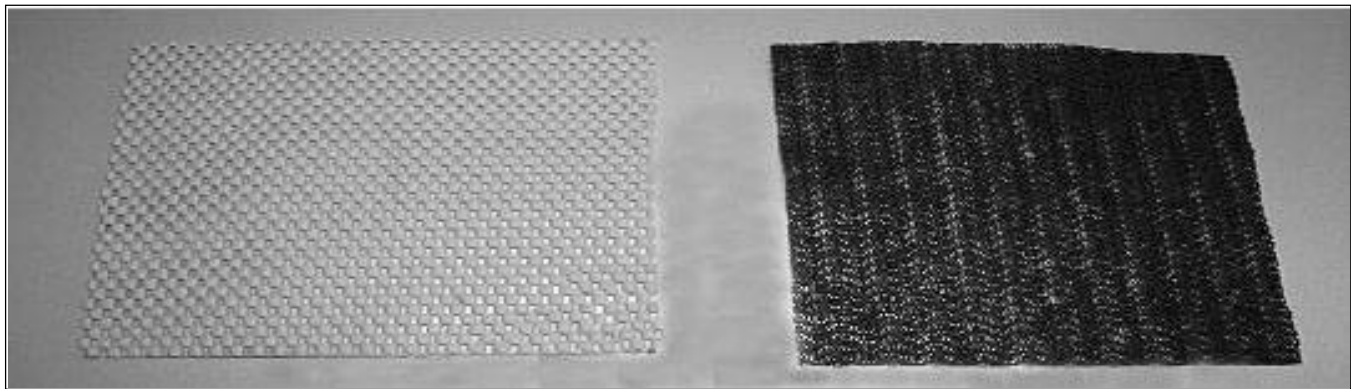
Not only is newly-appointed CBH-SAA 1st Vice President, **Gary McCain** an incredibly active volunteer, but he also manages to sport a lucky arrow now and then as attested by this 34 2/16" wild boar that he recently harvested.

Traditional Archers Corner:

This month's Gadget, used by Traditional archers, is, probably, the easiest and one of the most useful: An arrow puller.

I know we have all struggled, sometimes, pulling arrows out of a target particularly when shooting with some of the high-powered traditional guys or compound shooters. There are a couple of pullers on the market that come to mind; one that looks like a rubber cookie with slots cut into it and another that is a round rubber cylinder with an arrow slot running from front to back. There is nothing wrong with these pullers and there are plenty of archers that use them all the time with great success. These pullers are a little bulky to carry and a little costly. Prices on these commercial pullers range from six to twenty-six dollars each and hang from your belt or quiver but they work great. However, I'm a Scot and a little frugal, so saving a buck or two here-and-there is always lurking in my little mind. About eight years ago, I ran into a Trad Guy, at one of our shoots, and he was using as an arrow puller, which looked like a small piece of rubber-like, soft and flexible, grid material. He gave me a piece to try and I was instantly hooked. I have carried one of these little things ever since and they work like a charm.

Now here is the big secret: The arrow puller is nothing more than a piece of soft plastic shelf liner that your wife or girlfriend have been using for years. The shelf liner comes in many colors and different patterns but are, basically, nothing more than rubber-like thick plastic sheeting with a grid pattern of holes molded into it. We put them on our kitchen shelves to keep the crockery from sliding around on the shelf and, of course, to protect the shelf. The picture shows samples of different patterns but they seem to work equally well.



Our Dollar Store sells a roll of this stuff, one foot by six foot that will give you plenty of pullers (twenty-four if you cut them six by six and my math is correct) and enough to last you a long time. When you go to use one; just wrap it around that pesky little arrow and give it a pull. They really do work and work well. The pullers are easy to carry in your pants pocket or on your quiver or even in your "pocket tee".

Who said archery has to be expensive! Have fun and be careful out there.

Legislative Information- Robert Moore

I would like to thank everyone who attended the Fish and Game Commission (FGC) meeting in Riverside and/or sent letters in support of Commissioner Dan Richards.

For the last three years the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) has been setting up shop in California to implement their plan. Some people are under the assumption that they are the Humane Society (HS) that primarily runs animal shelters. HS is an animal welfare organization; HSUS is an Animal Rights organization. HSUS uses that misunderstanding to collect substantial amount of money to run that business under the façade of being a 501C3 non profit organization. HSUS web site address is www.humanesociety.org another deceptive ploy to make them appear they run animal shelters like HS. Under the tax code all 501C3 organizations are limited on what and how much can be spent politically such as lobbying. Subtle changes from the organization have been implemented to make them appear to support hunting if done under their version of best available science, whatever that means.

HSUS has convinced Senator Ted Leiu with co author Darryl Steinberg to gut and amend bill SB1221 from air pollution to the non use of Dogs for hunting bears and bobcats. History on this bill has it referred to the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee (NRW) with the first hearing date set for April 24th. As with all legislation this date could change. Not only should you send letters to your state representatives, you should also send them to the NRW committee members. Find the Committee members by going to <http://www.leginfo.ca.gov/yourleg.html> click on Your Legislature then Senate Committee membership.

Update to the Strategic Vision Project: The California Fish and Wildlife Strategic Vision Executive Committee, with assistance from BRCC and SAG, are developing three deliverables: The draft interim strategic vision in November 2011 (Completed), an interim strategic vision in February 2012 (Completed), and a strategic vision by July 1, 2012. The Executive Committee has adopted the recommendations from the BRCC and SAG on the Interim document. Final meetings will be held 3/28 through 4/20 to finish final document before sending to the Legislature and Governor.



Stolen

I am sure most of you have heard that at least three of our archery ranges in the Los Angeles area have been burglarized. Mojave Archers have in the last year been burglarized 7 or 8 times. The Oranco Bowmen were burglarized in the last month or so of 2011. Now, just a few days ago, March 24, 2012, the Pasadena Roving Archers Range was burglarized. In all the latest burglaries it appears the criminals know exactly what they need in order to gain entry and when to commit the crime. I think it is time that the clubs start thinking about ways to help the police identify and prosecute these criminals. I have no doubt that the criminals that hit one club are the same that are hitting the other clubs. –Wayne Raupe, CBH/SAA President

The Pasadena Roving Archers suffered a devastating loss of equipment and supplies as the result of a March 24th night break-in of their storage facility. Losses are estimated at around \$3,500 and are not covered by insurance due to the nature of items stolen – bows, arrows, quivers, armguards, tools, etc. The club, which has been offering a Public Instruction Program since 1972 may not be able to conduct regular classes for the first time in years. This, on the heels of a large increase in interest due to the this season's Hunger Games and Brave movies as well as the 2012 Olympic Games, strikes a huge blow against both the PRA and the community. Public donations are being accepted to rebuild the club's inventory for the Saturday classes. A fundraiser tournament is also being arranged to help recover losses. 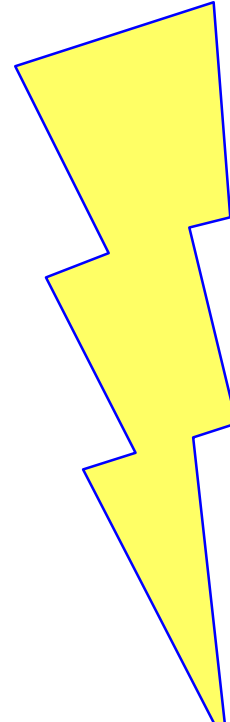

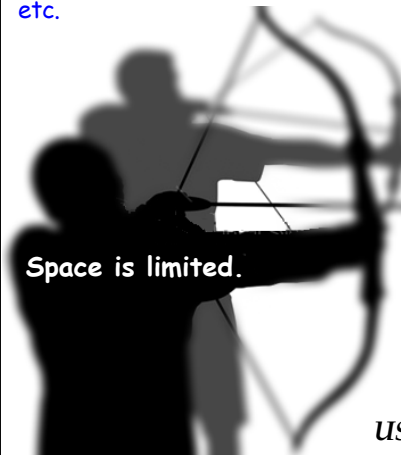

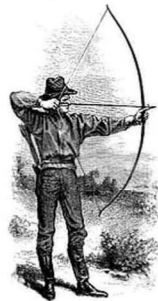

2012 CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

1. This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter as opposed to the tournament archer. It is designed to offer the hunter some benefits without his/her becoming entangled in the aspects of a Field tournament. NFAA rules do not apply to this event
2. The State Broadhead Tournament shall be either a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
3. The 2nd Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern this tournament.
4. The ranges for this event shall be laid out in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
5. Archers shall use hunting tackle for this event which is in keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.

A. Scoring:

- 1) Vital - 10 Kill - 8 Wound - 5
- 2) An arrow must be in the target to score, except a "Pass-through" which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
- 3) "Bounce-ins and "Glance-offs" shall not score.
- 4) "Antlers" do not score.
- 5) Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.
- 6) Double scoring is required.
- 7) This shall be a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardage.

B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:

- 1) Divisions
 - a) Seniors (65+)
 - b) Adult (18-64): Male and Female
 - c) Young Adult (ages 15-17): Male and Female
 - d) Youth (ages 12-14): Male and Female
- 2) Styles
 - a) Sight (S)
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Release (R)
 - d) Recurve (Rc) – Adults and Seniors only
 - e) Traditional (T) - Adults and Seniors only

C. Awards:

- 1) CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
- 2) Guest Class is one class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
- 3) No awards will be mailed.

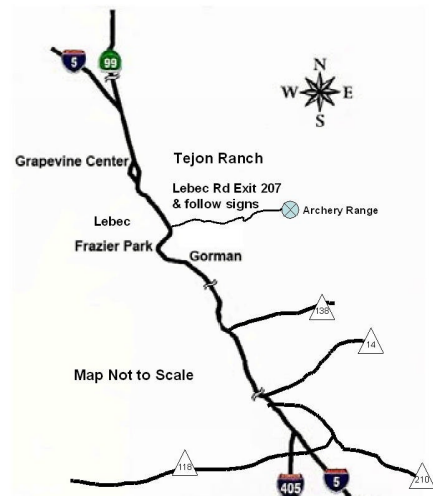
D. Tackle:

- 1) One stabilizer, not over 12 inches, allowed
- 2) Bow quivers allowed in all styles.
- 3) No magnifying scopes are allowed.
- 4) No compound bows over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no limit for peak draw weight.
- 5) Binoculars are allowed. No RANGE FINDERS!
- 6) No range finding devices allowed at any time on the range.
- 7) Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot – expandable broadheads are allowed if they meet Ca. Fish & Game Codes.

- 8) Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Code (7/8" minimum diameter)
- 9) Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- 10) All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- 11) Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
- 12) Longbows: Any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 13) Clickers allowed in all styles.

E. Miscellaneous:

- 1) Cubs: Due to safety considerations a Cub division will not be included in this event.
- 2) Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
- 3) All protests to the Protest Committee must be in writing within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the tournament and include a \$25.00 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
- 4) There must be three or more shooters per target at all times.
- 5) Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament.
- 6) No target or sight notes allowed. (sight tapes ok)
- 7) No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will not be assisted.
- 8) No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours – except for tournament officials.
- 9) Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
- 10) Rule violations can result in disqualification.
- 11) NO cell phones, computers or any other electronic devices allowed on the range or bow.
- 12) Tournament officials will have communication devises for emergencys and range duties.
- 13) Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualification.

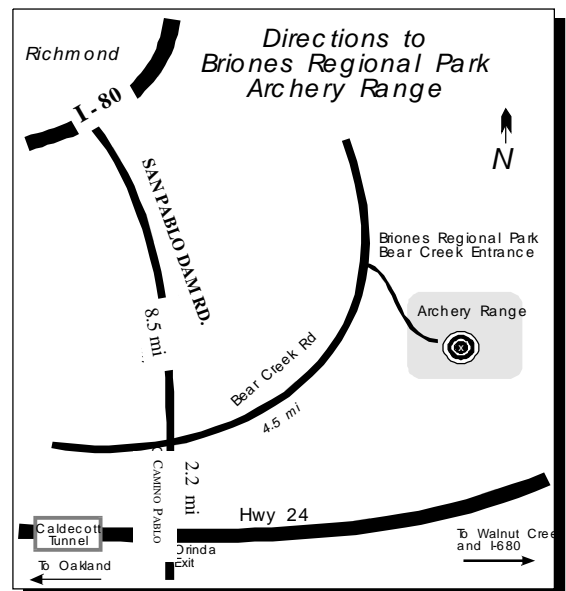
