"Correct me IF I'm wrong," was the way the sentence started. The statement was directed towards me and I assumed I would need to come up with an answer, and soon. The next comment followed, "I don't recall that you shot an arrow last year during your hunt for Mule Deer in Colorado." Oh busted again I thought, and rightfully so. I replied, YOU are correct. "And aren't those new arrows you're working on? - why do you need those?" One thing I've learned in fifty years of marriage is that the correct answer is the right one. And of course the

correct response. However, in my defense,... I believe one doesn't remain in one place. I believe one either is moving forward and trying to improve; or falling behind and headed backwards. It was late fall and work on possible new approaches was the routine pattern.



It was with that in mind I was "creating" new arrows to accompany a new frontier. It had been six years since I "played" with a new bow. I had jumped into a riser a friend suggested I try: one that would accept International Limb Fit style limbs (ILF). Even-though the Hoyt concept has been around for quite some time, it is only in the last 10 years the idea has taken hold of the traditional style industry. So inquisitive me had to finally investigate. With one riser in hand I ordered some ILF limbs so I could evaluate their usefulness to my hunting style. I must say the idea of one riser and having both recurve and longbow limbs fit - or several different poundages of limbs was quite appealing. Still, when I shoot a bow it is generally exclusively: not varying with animal size or target face. Thus my initial reluctance and procrastination



to this point had prevailed. But now: investigate I must. I include neither company nor brand names here as this article isn't meant to promote such. Continued on page 13

Regulatory Highlights

Did you know – California Fish and Game Code (FGC) §3004 makes is illegal to hunt and discharge a deadly weapon while within 150 yards of a residence or other building? FCG §3004 further prohibits the discharge of a firearm or release of an arrow or crossbow bolt over or across a public road or other established way open to the public in an unsafe and reckless manner.

With more and more residents moving to the country throughout California and the growing population of turkeys, wild pigs, deer and predators therein, urban hunting may help alleviate negative human-wildlife interactions and offer attractive hunting opportunities that would help recruit, retain and reactivate (R3) hunters. But where is urban hunting allowed?

In 2010, Contra Costa County Supervisor Gayle Uilkema proposed to ban archery practice and hunting with archery equipment in unincorporated Contra Costa neighborhoods and commercial districts after residents complained about an arrow shot from a neighbor's porch flying across a road and hit a deer "with a thump like a watermelon."

Local archers, archery shops, and CBH/SAA were instrumental in defeating this proposal that would have made criminals out of people who target practice in their backyards, hold archery tournaments, or work on their scouting archery badges.

This story also highlights the importance of following laws and regulations while hunting and how bad actors can create problems for the archery and hunting communities.

As summarized in the Legislative Team Update, there are several bills working through the State legislature that clamp down on guns, gun ownership, etc. CBH, together with our partners in the California Hunting and Conservation Coalition, (CHCC), work to defeat overreaching legislation and watch for indications that legislatures will someday move to restrict archery.

Are you familiar with local hunting and archery ordinances in your City/County? Where have you seen successful urban hunting regulations that could help increase hunting opportunities and R3? The CBH Legislative Team wants to hear from you!

Legislative Team Update -Over the last several months, the CBH Legislative Team has taken the following actions on behalf of our members:

- Helped defeat AB 1223 Firearm Excise Tax by signing coalition letter of opposition and sending clear and consistent messages to the legislature to "Just vote NO!".
- Signed letters of support for the confirmation of FGC commissioners Jacque Hostler-Carmesin, Samantha Murray and Erika Zavaleta. The FGC is now comprised of a female majority and these women have proven their understanding and fair support for the hunting, fishing and conservation communities.
- Signed a coalition letter of support to appoint John Ballotti to the FGC replacing the retired Commissioner Silva. Do you know someone that you would like to see appointed to the FGC? It is important that we help identify potential candidates and initiate a vetting process before vacancies are identified to help ensure appointees reflect our values and support the role of hunters and anglers in the conservation process.
- Expressed concern for SB 865 Wild Pigs and are now working with Bill Gaines to lobby for amendments that will protect Big Game Management funds, promote sustainable enforcement and defend against poaching of other game species, and preserve hunting opportunities for veterans and disabled archers.
- Signed a coalition letter of support for SB 865 Junior
 Hunting License that will increase the eligibility age
 of junior hunters from 15 to 17 in an effort to
 influence youth and retain adult hunters. SB 865
 recently passed out of Senate Natural Resources
 and Water Committee after being amended to
 include a 5-year sunset. Next, it moves on to Senate
 Appropriations Committee where it must be heard
 by May 20th to meet legislative deadlines.
- Signed a coalition letter of opposition for SB 915
 Firearms (State Property). This bill would prohibit
 the sale of any firearm, firearm part or ammunition
 on state property.
- Signed a coalition letter of support for SB 945
 Falconry. This bill would allow Peregrine falcons to be possessed for the sport of falconry. Peregrine falcons were removed from the federal and state endangered species list in 1999 and 2009, respectively after populations made an amazing recovery following federal bans on the use of the pesticide DDT.





Even though speed means little to me with heavy arrows and extremely high F.O.C. an arrow with impressively faster arrows will render higher kinetic energy. I did have one set

of 52# limbs at my draw weight which when shooting 512 grain arrows rendered 190fps and 41 kinetic energy. Out of the same bow shooting 585 grain arrows the speed dropped in 179 fps and remained at 41 KE.So for me in this scenario I would probably yield to a faster arrow as it gets the same energy there quicker. In the case of pronghorn and whitetail this could be the difference in a quick harvest or an arrow shot over the reactionary dropping each species displays on arrow deployment. Late fall is a fine time to tinker and just might open a new door for next year's hunt or the springs' tournament shooting. These are just my personal results and surely aren't factual guarantees by any means. The objective here was to share some experimentation with readers and hopefully encourage each to experiment on their own. Attack with learning in mind, have a playful attitude and HAVE FUN!

- Signed a coalition letter of opposition for SB 906 Firearms (School Disclosure). This bill is largely duplicative of existing gun ownership regulations and requirements and represents a gross invasion of privacy with the potential to negatively impact children's educational opportunities, gun ownership, hunting, and funding for conservation.
- Tracked AB 1737 Children's Camps (CBH Opposes), AB 1688 Firearms Remove Microstamping from Handgun Roster (CBH Supports), and AB 1753 Poaching (CBH Supports).
- Signed a coalition letter of opposition to the Humane Society of the United States' (HSUS) petition to the FGC to ban bear hunting. Bill Gaines also provided verbal comments on behalf of CHCC and CBH at the FGC meeting in February. The FGC referred the petition to the Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) for recommendation by the April 20, 2022 FGC meeting.
- Reviewed and discussed additional petitions submitted to the FGC with the CHCC including a

petition for a "traditional only" deer tag and an "omnibus" petition that calls for sweeping changes to big game tags. These petitions were submitted to the FGC by members of the hunting community and while CBH and the CHCC recognize the issues these petitions are targeted to address, additional analysis is needed.

Special Notice: At the February FGC meeting, the Commission voted to adopt proposed amendments to big game regulations to include preference points reinstatement and tag refunds due to public land closures for 2021-2022 hunting seasons (Amend Section 708.14, Title 14, CCR). The Commission also authorized the publication of a 15-day notice to clarify that the regulation does not sunset. Please watch the CDFW website for more information on how to request preference point reinstatement and tag refunds prior to this year's Big Game Drawing. TIME TO ACT WILL BE SHORT!





CBH/SAA State Broadhead Championship Tournament General Working Mechanics

- This tournament is designed to appeal to the bowhunter as opposed to the tournament archer. It is designed to offer the hunter some benefits without his/her becoming entangled in the aspects of a Field tournament. NFAA rules do not apply to this event
- The State Broadhead Tournament shall be either a one or two day event held on Memorial Day weekend.
- The 2rd Vice President of Hunting or his delegate shall govern this tournament.
- The range for this event shall be laid out in such a manner as to simulate hunting conditions when possible.
- Archers shall use hunting tackle for this event which is in keeping with California State Fish & Game Laws on Big Game Hunting.

A. Scoring:

- Vital 10 Kill 8 Wound 5
- An arrow must be in the target to score, except a "Pass-through" which must be witnessed and scored as witnessed by other shooters in the group.
- "Bounce-ins and "Glance-offs" shall not score.
- "Antiers" do not score.
- Shaft of arrow must touch the line for higher score.
- Double scoring is required.
- This shall be a one-arrow tournament at unmarked yardages.

B. Divisions and Styles of Shooting:

- Divisions
 - a) Seniors (65+)
 - b) Adult (18-64): Male and Female
 - c) Young Adult (ages 15-17): Male and Female
 - d) Youth (ages 12-14): Male and Female
- Styles
 - a) Sight (S)
 - b) Non-Sight (NS)
 - c) Release (R)
 - d) Recurve (Rc)
 - e) Traditional (T)

C. Awards:

- CBH/SAA Membership (Regular or Associate) is required to compete for awards.
- Guest Class is one class (Male and Female combined) and there will be no awards.
- No awards will be mailed.
- 4) Cubs and PeeWees Participation Award Only

D. Tackle:

- One stabilizer not over 12 inches, allowed. A Quivalizer is not considered a stabilizer
- Bow quivers are allowed in all styles.
- No magnifying scopes are allowed.
- No compound bows over 80 pounds peak draw weight. Recurves and longbows have no limit
- Binoculars are allowed No range finding binoculars allowed even with the battery removed NO RANGE FINDERS Period!
- Broadheads must be dulled and meet Fish & Game Codes at all times during the shoot – expandable broadheads are allowed if they meet Ca. Fish & Game Codes.

- Practice blades are allowed if they meet Fish & Game Codes (7/8" minimum diameter)
- Broadheads may be subject to size testing at any time during the tournament.
- All bows shall be limited to 300 fps with a 3% tolerance for differences in chronographs.
- Arrow speed may be checked anytime during the tournament.
- Longbows: Any type of arrow shaft is allowed.
- 12) Longbows: Must be shot off the shelf
- Clickers allowed in all styles.

E. Miscellaneous:

- Cubs and Peewees will shoot field points only
- Parents will be responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
- All protests to the Protest Committee must be in writing within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the tournament each day and include a \$25.00 fee which will be returned if the protest is upheld.
- There must be a minimum of three shooters per target at all times.
- Top shooters from each style will be grouped on the 2nd day of the tournament. Cubs and Peewees will not be allowed to shoot in top flight groups. NO EXCEPTIONS
- No target or sight notes allowed (sight tapes ok)
- No discussion of yardage prior to shooting. Discussions afterwards must be done in a manner to ensure that other archers who haven't shot will not be assisted.
- No one is allowed on the tournament course before or after the tournament shooting hours – except for tournament officials.
- Spectators will only be allowed with unanimous approval of the group.
- Rule violations can result in disqualification.
- NO cell phones, computers or any other electronic devices allowed on the range or bow.
- Tournament officals will have communication devices for emergencies and range duties.
- Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in disqualification.


