## DIRECTORS REPORT BY TOM DALEY

Our National Meeting this year was one day on April 25, 2015 from 8:30 am to 6:00 pm so we were very busy.

The NFAA has handed coaching over to the World Archery Association. Levels 1 and 2 are all handled and grandfathered in. Level 3 and 4 are still a problem. World Archery is all recurves and NFAA is both recurve and compound. World Archery can't seem to get a level 3 and 4 coach who can coach a compound and a recurve also fingers and a release so we're working on it.

2015 petitions will not go into effect until August 1, 2015, 30 days after the next publication of Archery Magazine.

NFAA is still investigating a merger with World Archery. We have a committee working on it but there are lots of issues.

With all that's going on with NFAA: the tournaments, KOA Camp, Headquarters, 3 Star Tournament, Vegas, the Indoor Nationals, Dakota Classic, World Archery Trials, Youth World Archery Championships our tournaments are growing.

The Youth World Championships will be held this year in Yankton, South Dakota. 600 kids, ages 15 to 19, from all over the world will be attending. 250 trainers will also be attending. Volunteers will be needed to fill 1000 work shifts.

The National Field Archery Association Meeting will now be held every other year in the odd number years. It will probably be held in Yankton, South Dakota. With the growth of the Tournaments it's hard to get in extra days for a meeting. So this was our best solution.

With the increase in the silver bowls at the Outdoor National Archery Championships the Council increased the registration fee by \$25. I disagreed with this whole heartily but could not win. The NFAA made a profit this year of over \$100,000. The World Archery Festival made over \$100,000. Our KOA Camp is doing great. Headquarters is doing great. NFAA is in the best shape it has ever been. So I was disappointed that they raised the registration fees. Their reasoning was that no tournament should start out knowing they are going to lose money. I hope it doesn't affect our attendance.

*Passed as amended: A one, two or three piece straight ended bow constructed of wood or laminated wood with non adjustable limbs. When the bow is braced, the string must not touch the limbs between the notches on the limbs.*

Archers who aren't going to attend the award ceremony and receive their award, especially those receiving a Champion Bowl, need to arrange someone to pick up their bowl or pay to have their award shipped. The cost of mailing awards is excessive and individuals should shoulder the expense whether in time or cost of mailing.

3.2 When an individual elects to have the earned bowl shipped, the cost of shipping will be the archer's responsibility. The archer may have someone else accept the award in his/her place.

Three piece take down longbows allow an inappropriate riser to replace the traditional longbow design. |  
Replace "A one, two or three" with "A one or two" piece...

Longbow limb description was changed too far, and inappropriately last year. Part of the original description needs to be returned.

3. A one or two piece straight ended bow of any material, which when strung displays one continued uni-directional curve which is measured as follows: When the strung bow is placed with the bowstring in a vertical position, the angle as measured between the tangent of any point on the limb and an imaginary horizontal line must always decrease as this point is moved further away from the bow grip.

Throughout our rule book our rules state "In all NFAA Rounds, an arrow shaft need only touch the line to be counted in the area of next higher value." See C, 5.2 on page 54.

The targets for this round are animal targets with the scoring area divided into two parts. The high scoring area is oblong while the low scoring area is the area between the high scoring area and the "hide and hair" line or "feathers", as the case may be. The area *outside the "hide and hair" line is considered a non-scoring area.* A bonus dot...

Delete the last half of the sentence... to read:

In Golf when new equipment comes around they do not offer competition for people using wooden shafts or aluminum shafts. Golfers are welcome to use that equipment but if they want to win, they will switch over to the newest most competitive equipment available. We had no one shoot these styles for the last two years at the National Outdoor and only 2 in 2013 and 6 in 2014 at the National Indoor. The promised Olympic shooters never showed up to shoot NFAA events as Pros.

Remove Freestyle Limited and Freestyle Limited Recurve from Professional Shooting.

Remove reference to Freestyle Limited Recurve in Article III

Remove Freestyle Limited and Freestyle Limited Recurve from Pro or Pro Senior under Styles of Shooting in Paragraph 2 of Section H in Article IV.

When NFAA hosts an IFAA Regional or World event... NFAA is the host of an IFAA event under IFAA Rules. It is not appropriate to have a policy saying that we will only recognize NFAA Rules.

We just held the National Outdoor and the IFAA World Field in Yankton, I feel that if we had run the two shoots at the same time (with a second Animal round being shot in the afternoon) we would have had a lot better turnout. It is hard to shoot for 10 days in a row much less getting that many days off from work.

Removing this would give the Council options for in the future.

DELETE

2006: It should be understood that effective 2006, it will be the NFAA's policy that at any NFAA hosted Championship Tournament, NFAA rules and only NFAA rules and styles will be recognized. This means no separate score cards or targets for other countries or organizations, or scoring methods will be allowed or recognized.

The policy that the Intent is less important than the "written word" is not appropriate. Our rules and policies are written by individuals who, in most cases, are not professional wordsmiths. Rather than give the Rules Interpretation Committee a requirement of dealing with the semantics alone, the Committee should be allowed to consider the Intent of our rules. The Committee's Ruling is reconsidered by the Board of Directors, and the intent of our rules should be more important than how someone tried to write the rule down.

Replace BDC-8-1980 with

2014: Both the written word and the intent will be used to interpret Constitution, By-Laws, and Policy Items.

While shooting indoors the only difference currently between BHFS/BHFSL and FS/FSL is that the BH shooters do not have lenses in their scopes. We either need to drop BHFS and BHFSL from being contested at the indoor or require the use of a BHFS sight. IFAA already has this rule in their rulebook.

Clarification of Bowhunter Freestyle sight is needed.

10. A sight with 4 or 5 fixed reference points will be allowed and neither the sight nor any reference point shall be moved during a round.

I would like to modify policy to allow all four sites to be used rotating between the eastern and western US.

For example – Mechanicsburg, PA, Darrington, WA, Watkins Glen, NY and Yankton, SD

1991: Outdoor National tournament

The National Outdoor Tournament will be awarded on a rotational basis, when possible, between the West, Mid and East United States areas. Rotating East, West, East, Mid if there are two available East sites. If no bids are received for a given year, the next region in line will be accepted. Rotation will also be affected if the bid is considered not to be acceptable. This action to be effective in 1992.

As an example, the cost to order the minimum number of exotic patches is \$187.50 – more than the income taken in each year. Once ordered, it is unlikely the new patches will be sold.
